- c. They would like to have 30 (4' \times 6' \times 3") rubber stall mats (\$35/ea) to put on the cement slab. It was discussed and tabled until the next meeting when we have a decision on concrete/asphalt.
- d. They would like to move the shot and discus ring back towards the trees and throwing to the South. This would free up the football field for practice. If they did this, they would need to have the holes reset for the posts on the discus net. They would like to keep the net in the same area. To do this, they would need 2 concrete slabs that are approximately 10' x 10'. Dan Hastings volunteered to do this project before winter. Dan will meet with Mr. Polt, Ms. Lockman, and Mr. Ashby. Voted on motion passed to have Dan do the removal and replacement work and charge the Booster club for materials.
